Whereas the purpose of the New Orleans Career Center is to prepare New Orleanians for mid-skill careers in high-demand industry sectors that offer sustaining wages and tangible opportunities for professional growth, and

Whereas National Apprenticeship Week, November 13-19, 2023, and the 85th anniversary of the Louisiana Apprenticeship Law are important to the advancement of workforce development in New Orleans and across the state, and

Whereas registered apprenticeships are recognized by employers, industry associations, government, labor organizations, community-based organizations, and career and technical education (CTE) providers as instrumental to building the regional economy, and

Whereas apprenticeships are a proven industry-driven training model that provides residents extra propulsion into good jobs and improves access to those jobs among individuals who have historically been underserved, marginalized, and otherwise adversely impacted by systemic inequities, and

Whereas New Orleans Career Center applauds the state legislature for passing the Louisiana Apprenticeship Law, the Louisiana Workforce Commission for its efforts to promote Registered Apprenticeships in Louisiana, and supports the expansion of apprenticeship opportunities across industries as an entry-point into satisfying family-sustaining careers, and
