

Key Goals for Expanding, Diversifying and Modernizing Registered Apprenticeship

- **Expansion**: Overall expansion of the system (1 million annually served by 2026)
 - Key Measures: Total Served, Active Apprentices, New Apprentices
 - Key Activities: State Funding, Apprenticeship Building America Grants




- **Diversification (Equity):** Increasing access for under-represented populations
 - Key Measures: Extent to which RA reflect the communities in which it operates
 - Key Activities: DEIA TA Center, Partnership with TradesFutures, Data Dashboards, ABA: Equity/Pre-Apprenticeship
- Industry Penetration: Expansion of apprenticeship into non-traditional industries and occupations
 - Key Measures: Number of New/Active Apprentices/Programs in Non-Traditional Industries/Occupations
 - Key Activities: National Industry Intermediaries, Hubs, Sector Sprints


Key Goals for Expanding, Diversifying and Modernizing Registered Apprenticeship

- Quality: Ensure continued strong outcomes and benefits of Registered Apprenticeship for Career Seekers and Industry
 - Key Measures: Completion Rates, Wages, Employment and Retention Rates, ROI
 - Key Activities: Registered Apprenticeship Academy, Data Dashboards, Technical Assistance, and Oversight
- Modernization (Innovation): Ability of system (and related processes) to evolve and be responsive to emerging industry needs and changing economic conditions
 - Key Measures (Harder to Measure): Emergence of New Models, Improved/ Streamlined Processes, Upgraded Systems, E-Tools and Resources, etc.
 - Key Activities: Regulatory Enhancements, Electronic Tools and Resources, RAPIDS Upgrades

Active Apprentice Count | FY 2013 - FY 2023








Industry Penetration: Growth In Both Traditional And Non-traditional Industries




2021-2023 ACA Recommendations Status Update: Implementation Methods

- State Apprenticeship Expansion Grants, Apprenticeship Building America Grants, Pre-Apprenticeship Partnership with TradesFutures, New Intermediaries (Investments)
- Launched Trailblazers and Youth Apprenticeship Week (Promotion and Partnerships)

Highlights of Actions Taken to Date (cont.)

- Issued Pre-Apprenticeship TEN (Policy/Technical Assistance)


The Road Ahead

ACA Charter

The objective and scope of the ACA is to provide advice and recommendations to the Secretary on ways to better utilize the apprenticeship training model to provide equitable career pathways that advance the dignity of work for everyone, emphasizing four strategic areas as follows.

- a. **the modernization** of the Registered Apprenticeship model and **the promotion of innovation** across the National Apprenticeship system;
- b. the **expansion and diversification** of apprenticeships into **new industries and sectors**;
- c. the establishment of apprenticeship pathways, inclusive of pre-apprenticeship and youth apprenticeship, that promote career pathways to good jobs with family sustaining wages; and
- d. equitable access for all workers to participate and succeed in the National Apprenticeship system.
