Project Scope/ Summary of Program Activities: Base formula funding from DOLETA (\$474,623) will be used by the Community College System of New Hampshire (CCSNH) to 1/ Foster DEIA to ensure that underserved populations benefit from these programs and to increase the pipeline of apprentices

SAEF2 funds will be specifically dedicated to supporting DEIA among its Registered Apprenticeships through a combination of outreach campaigns and support services to ensure that RAPs consistently benefit underserved and underrepresented populations. SAEF2 will also increase enrollment and retention by expanding support services to new and existing apprentices. This includes continuing the significant progress made with high schools, students, and parents through the SAE20 grant.

Finally, Year 2 of our State Plan will focus on supporting the development of

Pre-apprenticeships and Registered Apprenticeships in industries where they are needed. By expanding Apprenticeship pathways to new sectors, CCSNH intends to have a transformational effect on their perception by students and employers, leading to increased interest and enrollments.

Outcomes of Year 2 base funding include:

- Increase enrollment of underrepresented populations from 30% to 32%
- Increase statewide WIOA co-enrollment from .33% to 2.33%
- Reduce pre-apprenticeship /RAP cancellation rate from 38% to 36%
- Create 5 bilingual marketing resources for outreach
